In the name of God Amen; the one and twentieth
Day of June 1631 in the seventh year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord Charles
by the grace of God King of England, Scotland, France and Ireland, defender of the
Faith and Captain John Smith of the parish of St Sepulchres London Elquid being
like in body but of perfect mind and memory thanke be given unto Almighty God
therefore, Revoking all former wills by me heretofore made, Do make and ordaine this
my last will and testament in manner followinge first I comitt my Soule into the hands
of Almighty God my maker hoping through the meritts of Iesus Christ my Redeemer
to receive full remission of all my sinnes and to inherit a place in the everlastyng Kingdom
my body I comitt to the earth from whence it came to be interred according to the direction
of myne Executors hereunder named And of such worldly goodes wherof it hath pleased
God in his mercie to make me an unworthy Receiver, I give and bequeath them as here
after followeth first I give and bequeath unto Thomas Parker Esq one of the Clerke of
his Most Gracious Maie and to his heirs for ever all my Land tenements and hereditaments
whatsoever situate lyinge and beinge in the parishes of Dowthie and greate Darenton in
the Countie of Kent together with my Boate of Charles. Item my Will and meaning is
that in consideration thereof the said Thomas Parker shall disburse and paye all such sumes
of money and charges as hereafter in this my Will are given requiered and referred not except
ing the sume of fower score pounde of lawfull money of England That to saye first I bequeath
unto my selfe to be disposed as I shall thinke good in my life by me the sume of twenty pounde
Item he shall disburse about my funerals the sume of twenty pounde Item I give and
bequeath out of the residue of the said fower score pounde as followeth, vizt I give
and bequeath unto my much honored and most worthy friend Sr Samuel Galtoustaill
Knight the sume of ftyve pounde Item to Mr Edward the sume of five pounde Item to my
sister Smith the widowe of my brother the sume of Ten pounde Item to my Sonne
Steven Smith and his sister the sume of five pounde Thirtie shillings and fower
pence betwene them Item to the said Thomas Parker Joane his wife and Elizabeth his
daughter the sume of Ten pounde among them Item to Mr Bennet the Saynt of the
Woulsmiths hall the sume of fortie shillings All with bequeath my meaning and will
shall be paid by the said Thomas Parker his heirs Executors or Administrators within
one year after my decease Item I give unto Thomas Parker some of the above sayd
Thomas Parker my trunk standing in my Chamber at Sr Samuel Galtoustaills
house in St Sepulchres parish together with my best suite of apparell of a tawny
color vizt hose, doublet, jerkin and Shooes Item I give unto him my trunk bound with
iron barres standing in the house of Richard Hyde in Lambeth together with halfe
the booke therein to be chosen by the said Thomas Parker and allowed by myne
Executors and the other halfe part of the booke I give unto Mr John Dreddestin and
the said Richard Hyde to be divided betwene them Item I nominate apoint and
ordaine my said much honored friend Sr Samuel Galtoustaill, and the said Thomas
Parker the elder joint Executors of this my last will and testament the manner
